# **Crash Trend**August to October




The trend of count of Crashes for Date Time Reported (MY). The view is filtered on Date Time Reported (MY), which has multiple members selected.

From August 1st to October 31st, WPD responded to an average of 102 accidents per month. This is a 3% increase from July to September's average.

WPD officers conducted 44 fewer traffic stops in October compared to the month of September, but 13 more stops when compared to August.






There were 108 total vehicle crashes in the month of October, which is 6 more than last month and 10 more than August. There were 52 Accident Reports completed. 56 accidents were non-reportable.

The highest crash hour in October was 4pm.


Sector 3 had the highest number of crashes at 38 for the month, followed by Sector 4, then 1, and 2.




In the month of October, there were 374 total traffic stops, resulting in 188 Citations, 156 Warnings, 18 with No Enforcement, and 12 Arrests. There were also 17 DUI Arrests made.


Note: DUI Arrests are not always a result of a Traffic Stop and are sometimes a result of a Traffic Crash.

The top reasons for Traffic Stops were Expired Registration, Speeding 15-19 over, Failure to Obey Lane Marking and Sign Marking, and Failure to Have Vehicle Inspected.

## Top Reasons for Traffic Stops





# Winchester Police Department October Traffic Enforcement Heat Map




## Distracted Driving by Code



In October, there were 31 Citations and 6 Warnings written for distracted driving, making a total of 37.

30 were under the State Charge Section Code 46.2-818.2 and 7 were under the Local Charge Section Code 14-35.
